





On 19 July 2021 the Government removed almost all COVID-19 restrictions across England.

	
<p>There is no limit on the number of people you can meet. But you should try to meet outdoors.</p>	<p>Masks are still recommended in crowded public places and on public transport.</p>
	
<p>Social distancing is no longer compulsory.</p>	<p>In London, masks are still required on public transport.</p>
	
<p>It is still important to practise good hygiene and wash your hands often</p>	

The rules on self-isolation have also changed.

	
<p>If you are under 18 or are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 you DO NOT have to self-isolate if you have been in contact with someone who tests positive</p>	<p>BUT you are advised to take a PCR test as soon as possible and wear a mask around other people while you wait for your test result.</p>
	
<p>If you are not fully vaccinated, you must still self-isolate for 10 days if you have been in close contact with someone who tests positive for COVID-19 or if YOU test positive.</p>	

How to get a vaccine

If you are 18 or over and would like to get a vaccine, you can go to vaccination centre without an appointment.
